



CONFLICT MANAGEMENT

There is a tendency in higher education to set aside difficult issues in an attempt to preserve a collegial environment, but this can lead to less accountability and issues simmering quietly rather than being resolved. This learning plan will help you develop your understanding of conflict, what causes it, and strategies for managing it when it arises.
